

The 4-4-2 Reading Challenge:

How, where and when your child can use their Challenge card

Who can take part?

Any young person aged 5-12 can take part through participating libraries.

How long does your child have to collect their stamps?

The Reading Challenge will run from 6th February 2018 until the 31st May 2018.

Which games can your child get tickets for?

All tickets must be redeemed for SPFL games which fall before the 31st October 2018.

How many tickets can your child get per completed Challenge card?

When they complete a Challenge card, your child is entitled to one free child match ticket and one discounted adult ticket at participating SPFL Clubs.

How can your child claim their tickets?

Challenge cards must be presented to the relevant SPFL Club ticket office along with a valid library card (library cards are available for free at your local library).

How many tickets can my child use per match?

Only one free child ticket and discounted adult ticket can be redeemed against one match. A minimum discount of 20% will be applied to the adult ticket.

How many Challenge cards can my child complete?

A young person may repeat the Reading Challenge as many times as they wish within the allocated timescales following the process stated above.

Who can use the tickets?

The free child ticket must only be used by the young person participating in the Reading Challenge. All tickets are subject to availability as dictated to by the corresponding SPFL Club. In some instances, Challenge cards may not be redeemed against certain games.
