

The 4-4-2 Reading Challenge Guidelines for library staff

We're pleased to announce that children aged 5-12 have been invited to take part in the [4-4-2 Reading Challenge](#) in your library! Here's what you need to know to help them take part:

- > Children will need a Challenge card to take part. You will have a stock of these and should issue one card for every participating child.
- > Ask the child or their parent/carer to fill in their details on the Challenge card. Then you need to log the child's participation in the 4-4-2 Reading Challenge. Your Challenge Co-ordinator will let you know how to do this, as the method will be tailored to meet the needs of your library service.
- > Children need to borrow and return **4 books** to complete the Challenge. They can borrow and return the 4 books together or over multiple visits. Children can take part in the 4-4-2 Reading Challenge as many times as they like, for as long you have Challenge cards in stock!
- > Each time they return one of the books, stamp their Challenge card with your library's stamp. Once their Challenge card has 4 stamps, children and their parents/ carers should take it to a participating football club's ticket office to exchange for a free child's ticket and discounted adult ticket to a home game. **Full details of participating SPFL football clubs plus terms and conditions can be found at scottishbooktrust.com/442.**

The 4-4-2 Challenge Card is a postcard of this design, illustrated by Anders Frang. Each participating child should be issued with a card. Once they've collected 4 stamps, they can start again! Children can collect stamps until **31st May 2018**.
