

What's Your Story?

Teens aged 14-17 can apply for our What's Your Story? programme for support, mentoring and the chance to help programme StoryCon. Teens can also submit to What's Your Story? magazine for feedback on their work.

Created by teens for teens, **StoryCon** is Scotland's free conference for 13–19-year-olds interested in writing, illustration and more. Previous workshops have included blogging, writing for film and TV, creating comics and performing their work.
